



Tuesday 20th May 2025 at 12 noon.



WONDAI ORCHID SOCIETY SHOW APRIL 2025

Joe and Teresa recently attended the Wondai Orchid Society Show benching 13 orchids to support the show resulting in 2×1 st, 1×2 nd and 2×3 rds, winning the Oncidium section with the most points scored.

Exhibitors were greeted by everyone and invited to stay for breakfast, sausage sanga, while the judging was happening. Everyone was made to leave the hall with an annex available for all to stay and wait as well as the breakfast.

Plant sales were vast with lots of garden plants. They also had foliage, creative floral and photography sections with lots of entries. Total benched in all categories was 178 entries.

Teresa reported that for a society of 14 members the show was a great success given the numbers involved. The Show was well supported and a credit to their club.







Softcane Dendrobiums

Mainly Spring flowerers. In the warmer months, new green leafy growths develop, lengthen and produce roots. New growths may need staking. In the cooler months, plants may lose their leaves and produce flowers along the cane. Water sparingly in Winter and DO NOT fertilize in Winter. Softcanes grow well in the Brisbane area under shadecloth, however it is beneficial to expose Softcanes to full sun (hang them on the clothesline if possible) from Mother's Day, returning them to more shade on Father's Day.







APRIL 2025 NEW GROWERS MEETING

April's New Growers Meeting was attended by 27 members and 1 visitor.

Zelda obliged with some tips and tricks on overgrown/unruly plants and suggested new growths hanging down could be remedied by placing a label under the growth in a hollow and turning the plant to the sun to encourage the growth to change course. There was some discussion on rotting growths and the use of boron as a remedy.

Zelda tackled yet another Cattleya of the large neglected plants that had been donated to the Society and proceeded to divide it into 5 pieces, explaining the process along the way. The resulting pieces were given to Alan, Liz, Sandra & Ross, Bob B and Sheryll to leave them on the bench in their shadehouses until Spring by which time they should have developed strong root systems, ready for potting.

Rainie brought along 16 bundles of Softcane keikis to give away and they were snapped up by members wanting to try their hand at growing Softcanes.

There were only 2 plants benched with Alan taking home 'The Finger' for his lovely white Miltoniopsis—Milt. Lillian Nakamoto 'tonto', and Rainie claiming 1st for her C. Unknown. New Growers, please don't be shy Bring along your orchids, we'd love to see what you're growing out there and there's nothing more disappointing than to see nearly empty benches at meetings. Benching your plants is a great way to start a conversation/share with other members, learn from the judges what they're looking for quality wise and perhaps get some advice on how better to present

your blooms. It's all good practice for our Shows.

- The essay must be no more than 4,000 words, short essays are most welcome.

- The authors of the essays will remain undisclosed to the judges, whose decision will be final. If
 in the opinion of the judges, no worthy essays are received, there will be no award that year.
- Non-winning entries will be returned to the sender if requested. These entries may be submitted to the editors of Australian orchid periodicals for publication, with permission from the author.
- The winning essay will be announced at the AGM of the Foundation in October 2025.
- The winning entries will be placed on the AOF web site and maybe published in Australian orchid periodicals.

SEED CAPSULE MATURITY

Estimating the ripening time of a seed capsule is a difficult task. Many an amateur and professional hybridizers have had the disappointment of finding the seed capsule of that desired cross split and its contents scattered to the wind.

There are many factors that come into play regarding the ripening of a seed capsule e.g. time of the year, weather conditions during maturation of the capsule, the fertility of a cross etc.

After fertilization, seed development can be gauged by the swelling and ripening of the developing seed capsule which may take a few weeks or occasionally as long as a year or more, depending on the genus. As a seed capsule ripens it changes colour from green to yellow or brown then splits to release the seed into the air. It is recommended that when the seed capsule begins to yellow at one end, it is ripe for harvesting and sending to the seed bank.

If you are unsure of how much time is left before the capsule will split, try tying tissue paper or an empty tea bag over the capsule a few weeks beforehand and examine it from day to day.

Below is a list of the expected time for ripening of seed capsules. This is an *approximate guide only* and may be of assistance to new growers.
