#### IT'S NEARLY SHOWTIME....

With only weeks to our Spring Show, it's time to go through your collection to remove dead leaves/flowers and weeds and generally tidy up any prospective Show plants, either for sale or benching. Make sure that pots are clean and will not fall over when benched. Plants for benching or sale should be well established in their pots and free of pests and diseases. Buds should be staked to ensure that blooms are displayed to their best advantage. Presentation is everything. This applies not only to flowering plants but also to the myriad of non-flowering plants in the Plant Sales area. It's no good leaving these chores until the last minute as time is whizzing by.

If you are selling plants, be realistic with your pricing and please make sure that your price tags are legible—whole dollars only please. All sales need to be keyed in to the computer so it really does help if figures are clearly written otherwise you may end up a little light in your expected return.

Donations of cakes, biscuits, slices etc are greatly appreciated for morning/afternoon teas.

The success of our Show really depends on the efforts of Society members so please give some thought as to what /where you might be able to contribute, however small. Many hands make light work!

Set up for the show will be at the Orchid House on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October at 1pm.

Set up of the indoor bowls club will start at 11am on Thursday  $19^{\text{th}}$  October.

Those helpers who wish to bench orchids or foliage are welcome to bring them inside out of their cars into The Orchid House.

Benching will start after 2pm.-5pm before the Judges dinner.



#### SEPTEMBER 2023 NEW GROWERS MEETING

Teresa showed the groups how to repot badly neglected Oncidiums and talked about their ongoing cultural needs with Joe and Sandy speaking to the groups on growing Vandas with Joe demonstrating how to transfer Vanda seedlings to their permanent homes and how to manage the long wire hangers which are ideal for vandas. Very positive feedback was given on this form of meeting so now that Covid is hopefully behind us Zelda intends to use this format in the coming year for some meetings.

She then went on to say that she had tested the plant and it was not virused. The unevenness of colour on one bloom was caused by genetics not virus. It was the second time the plant had bloomed this way and she had a policy of three times and you are 'out'. As Zelda didn't care for the unevenness of colour she gave the plant to Tay with 'not virused' written on the back of the tag. She then followed up with a repeat of her Power-Point presentation on viruses to show the difference between 'colour break' and the plant that she had brought along. Editor

#### A TALE OF WOE

Spring has sprung and in the orchid house, the pests have become even more active and peskier. I thought I had those with legs under control but alas, I was misguided and lulled into a false sense of security with Winter. Along with Spring comes the spikes on a range of plants and especially Den. lindleyi. I had purchased a relatively small lindleyi plant from Brian Heath when he came to our meeting a couple of years ago to tell us about Den. Hilda Poxon. A few weeks ago to my great delight, the plant produced spikes. Every morning with cup of tea in hand, I would admire the healthily growing spikes until one morning my world came crashing down. Every spike was gone. Eaten right off. Of course, whatever it was didn't stop there. It feasted on the spikes of other plants. I suspected a large grasshopper or cockroaches so I sprayed the orchid house with Carbaryl and laid out lots of cockroach baits. That night I went to the orchid house several times but couldn't see anything. I shook and moved plants to see if the grasshopper jumped away. This went on for a number of nights. Nothing. Perhaps my attempt at extermination was successful. I do have a large specimen of lindleyi but it was showing no signs of spiking at the time so I thought it was having a rest this year. Days later, I was delighted to see spikes from that specimen so all was not lost. Again, cup of tea in hand each morning early, I checked progress of the spikes. I recounted the story to Ros R who suggested that perhaps I should put a net over it. I agreed and decided to source the netting and do that the next day. Yep, you guessed it, cup of tea in hand and checked the next morning – all gone. I still can't find the culprit but I have now also laid mouse baits. Tonight I will be in the orchid house again with the headlamp on. So the message is - don't become complacent with pests and keep up the maintenance activities even through winter.

There is however a positive. As much as I try to keep the mealy bug in check, there is always some that you come across. I suspect that is the case in most orchid houses. Using a strong led headlamp searching the orchid house at night, looking into all the nooks and crannies, I was surprised how the white mealy bug and others stood out. I dealt with them on the spot.

A slightly different scenario regarding another pest problem— Having caught the hose on an outdoor pot, I must have left the door to my shadehouse open long enough for a large brown grasshopper to fly in and didn't realise he was there until I went to take a plant from the shelf for the Cultural Meeting. I reached out to grab him and he sprang away. I hunted through all my plants a number of times to no avail for the remainder of Tuesday and Wednesday morning, then whilst looking for a wire hanger for Ros R, I spied him right at the top of the shadehouse. So with Ros keeping an eye on him/her, I grabbed a can of insect spray and blasted away and we proceeded to chase him down the wall, me with my can of spray and Ros armed with a wire hanger. While killing ourselves with laughter, we managed to drown/whack the blighter and Ros promptly despatched him with a well placed stomp. Great team work—thanks Ros! Lesson learned—make sure there's no way the hose can get caught in future before going in to water. Sandy



#### SEPTEMBER 2023 CULTURAL MEETING

September's Cultural Meeting attracted 27 members plus 2 guests, with a number of apologies recorded.

While the Cattleya, Dendrobium and Phalaenopsis classes were well represented, the other side of the hall was a little light on, however quite a number of quality plants were benched all round. 45 orchids, 6 of which belonged to New Growers and 43 foliage plants were benched,

Our Guest Speaker for the day was Robert Trost from RoLin Orchids assisted by his wife Linda. Robert brought along a number of his exotic Vandaceous plants and explained their background and growing requirements. An interesting learning point was that some of his plants could take 15 or so years to flower. Obviously growing orchids is not an overnight wonder! Robert spoke of how the native orchids are the foundation of the hybrids that we have today and in fact, he was wanting to go back to those foundations to start remaking hybrids. Hybrids can only be made so many times to produce plants with vigor. He also talked about going to Komodo Island to chase down an orchid that grows high in the trees there. He laughed about the dragons being 'bities'. It was also interesting to hear Robert mention that Wamuran, where he is now, is 3 to 4 degrees cooler than where he was and this had impacted on his growing of his orchids.

Robert and Linda brought along a lot of interesting Species Vandas and members were very keen to acquire some for their collections. New Growers present were reminded that RoLin Orchids are sponsoring the Champion New Grower Award with a \$100 voucher to purchase orchids at their nursery. By the look of things, there will be keen competition among our New Growers for the top prize.

Ron Russell related his recent experience with pest/pests unknown which have done some damage in his orchid collection. Let's hope there are no more of those critters about Ron.

As Robert's talk was relatively short, the meeting finished a little earlier than normal so it gave time for all hands on deck to put things in place for the Electoral Commission to take over our Hall on Wednesday for the coming Referendum.

A cuppa, some goodies to eat and a quick chat completed our meeting.



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
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# **BIOS Birthday Lunches**
